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Three New Parisian Hotels To Book For A Summer In The City

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
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Paris is having a 'moment' with a slew of new openings shaking up the hotel scene. Here are three of the latest properties illuminating the City

of Lights...

Hôtel Dame des Arts, 6th Arrondissement

Just opened in Saint-Germain on Paris' Rive Gauche, just a short walk from Notre Dame Cathedral, **Hôtel Dame des Arts** is found in a 1950s building with interiors by designer Raphael Navot, the 2023 winner of the Maison&Objet 'Designer of the Year' Award.

The 109 bedrooms and suites showcase Navot's flair for creating unique, beautiful spaces and furniture. Although each guestroom is individually designed, all feature bespoke art pieces and many have an outdoor terrace overlooking either the rooftops of Paris or the Eiffel Tower.

One of the hotel's main highlights is the Rooftop Bar with its 360° views over the Eiffel Tower, Sacré-Coeur, the golden dome of Les Invalides, and Notre Dame Cathedral. The Rooftop Bar, and an indoor restaurant with an adjacent outdoor garden courtyard has been conceptualised by the former operational director of Experimental Group, Matthieu Alfandari.



Meanwhile, chef Othoniel Alvarez Castaneda oversees the culinary offering, which features seasonal dishes that fuse classic French cuisine with a contemporary Mexican twist. Othoniel brings a sustainably minded culinary vision to the hotel, with dishes designed to be shared in celebratory style, and where each menu item is inspired by one hero ingredient and sourced from quality local produce. It's the epitome of good taste.


Le Grand Mazarin, 4th Arrondissement

Opening in June, **Le Grand Mazarin**, by hotel group **Maisons Pariente**, is perhaps one of the city's most anticipated openings of the year. Maisons Pariente is renowned for its starry hotels: Lou Pinet in Saint-Tropez, Crillon le Brave in Provence and Le Coucou in Méribe, and Le Grand Mazarin will be the first foray into the capital city for the French company.

Carved out of three heritage buildings, which date back to the 14th century, interior architect Martin Brudnizki has implemented his usual showstopping signature design, while restoring the landmark property to its original grandeur. Guests can expect flamboyant décor which celebrates French classicism, enhanced by the best of Parisian artisan skill.

Found in the heart of Le Marais, the hotel has 50 rooms and 11 suites with the refined interiors featuring an eclectic collection of vintage furniture and objects.

As well as two bars, an indoor pool and a hammam, the signature restaurant encompasses the festive spirit of 'Boubalé', meaning "my little darling" in Yiddish, the affectionate code name used by Eastern European grandmothers to talk about those they love. At the helm is Israeli chef Assaf Granit, who is inspired by the Ashkenazi culinary tradition of his childhood.
